St. Clair County Coastal Community Flooding – Update

The United States Army Corp of Engineers indicated there is evidence the ice blockage continues to ease with the decline of gauges upstream up St. Clair and the rise of gauges downstream. The gauge in Algonac is indicating evidence of ice impacts. Data gaps and suspiciously flat readings will require close monitoring. Water levels in Algonac and Lake St. Clair remain below pre-jam levels. The St. Clair gauge remains approximately 1.2 feet above pre-jam conditions and remains in minor flood stage.

The United States Coast Guard operations today consist of the Morro Bay prepping tracks for three vessels movements tomorrow through the St. Clair River.

St. Clair County Homeland Security and Emergency Management continues to monitor and assesses the situation while supporting local communities and coordinating with State, Federal and International partners. Twenty-two (22) self-assessment damage reports have been received to date.
