The St. Clair County Health Department (SCCHD) has identified **name** as being exposed or possibly exposed to the 2019 Novel Coronavirus. This serves as notification you are expected to cooperate with the SCCHD in efforts to prevent or control the transmission of this serious disease or infection under Michigan Public Health Code, Part 52.

St. Clair County Health Department fully anticipates compliance with the prescribed instructions in this “Warning Notice”. Additionally your compliance is appreciated and reflects your commitment to protect your family, friends, and community to prevent or stop the spread of this novel virus. A representative of the SCCHD shall verify your compliance with this request. Failure to comply with the conditions set forth in this notice may result in SCCHD petitioning the St. Clair County Circuit Court to implement enforcement procedures pursuant to Michigan Public Health Code, Part 52. Except in cases of emergency, you have the right to notice and a hearing and other rights provided by statute before the Circuit Court issues an order.

The issuance of this public health warning notice has been considered in the context of less restrictive means that could accomplish the same public health goals. SCCHD is committed to treatment with respect, fairness, and compassion, and will take steps to reduce the potential for hardship and stigma this action may create. As much as is possible and available SCCHD will provide supportive measures that assist individuals with this quarantine/isolation request, with particular attention to preserving dignity and privacy.

The St. Clair County Health Department requires you to:

1. Remain in your home or place of dwelling under “quarantine”. Duration of quarantine is set locally and follows the guidance of MDHHS and CDC. For the latest orders visits www.scchealth.co.

2. Quarantine means that all activities outside of your home or dwelling are prohibited (not allowed), unless of a life-threatening nature (medical illness etc.). This includes work, school, shopping, visiting friends or relatives, and other activities that would place you in contact with other people.
3. Limited contact with others who live with you should also be attempted. Do not share dishware, bedding or other potential methods of transmission with co-habitants. Wear a mask whenever you are within 6 feet of other people during entire isolation period. Mask wearing is strongly encourage throughout this pandemic.
4. Wash hands regularly for at least 20 seconds with soap and water. Cover your cough or sneeze with your arm or tissue and dispose of the tissue into a designated garbage can in your home.
5. You may be contacted daily by a SCCHD representative for symptom monitoring. It is the expectation that you view and will respond if indicated to all SCCHD communication during “quarantine”.
6. Vaccination against COVID19 is encouraged and can be pursued 14 days after your exposure. Vaccination greatly reduces your risk of contracting COVID19 or having severe illness. Because of the effectiveness of these vaccines a fully vaccinated individual who has a COVID19 exposure is not required to quarantine at home, but rather is able to continue to work/attend school with the precaution of wearing a mask for 14 days and getting a COVID10 test on day 3-5.
