
Winter Activities at St. Clair County Parks. The County Parks. The

There are numerous adventures that are just a short distance away, found in the over 1100 acres of parks and trails operated by St. Clair County. These outdoor winter activities are inexpensive ways to shake the winter blues. Most of the activities require nothing more than warm clothing and a good pair of walking boots.

If you are looking to go for a long distance winter walk, or love to in-line cross-country ski, then the Wadhams to Avoca Trail is for you. The twelve mile trail is highlighted by the 640 ft. Mill Creek Trestle, the longest of its kind in the State of Michigan. It offers breathtaking views of the Mill Creek, found 60 ft. below the trestle deck.




three County Parks have many miles of trails of different challenge levels, from flat terrain to rolling hills. So no matter your level of skill, there is a place to enjoy these winter activities.

Speaking of hills, one of the best sledding hills in the county is found at Columbus County Park. The lighted sledding hill offers two options of excitement, a bunny hill for younger children and a larger hill for the more daring. Snowboarding is not allowed on the hill.

If it's a flat surface you seek, then the ice rink at Goodells County Parks is for you. This park offers a large surface ice rink in the Arena building. It's outdoors, but covered, giving the ice a nice smooth surface. The Community Center lobby is a space to warm up and use the restroom facilities.
