## Children's Special Health Care Services - CSHCS (810) 987-6102

- Assistance with care coordination including referrals and advocacy for children who have medical conditions that are chronic, disabling or terminal
- Insurance coverage can start with birth and last to 21 years of age

- Identification of outbreaks and prevention of epidemics
- Investigation and reporting of communicable diseases
- Tuberculosis (TB) testing, treatment and follow-up for individuals exposed

### Maternal & Infant Health Program - MIHP (810) 987-4903

- FREE benefit for Medicaid eligible pregnant women and infants up to age 1
- Medicaid and WIC enrollment assistance
- Promoting healthy pregnancies and positive birth outcomes
- Help finding prenatal care providers
- Referrals and education

### Naloxone (Narcan®) Training & Rescue Kits (810) 987-5300

- FREE Naloxone training
- FREE rescue kits to anyone 18 or older at risk\* of an opioid overdose or those who have contact with someone at risk of an opioid overdose

### Personal Health Clinic (810) 987-5300

- CONFIDENTIAL services provided
- Services available for insured and uninsured individuals
- Variety of services provided:
  - Birth control
  - FREE condoms
  - Pregnancy testing and referrals
  - STI and HIV testing and treatment

\*At-risk refers to the group of individuals susceptible to the event of interest (e.g., living in an old home, infection, disease) at or during a specific time.

- "The Exchange" program offers FREE, and confidential services
- The "Exchange" program includes:
  - New needles and needle exchange
  - Safe injection education and materials
  - Narcan® training and kits
  - Outreach referrals

### Vision & Hearing Screening (810) 987-5300

- Provides FREE:
  - Hearing screening to kindergarten, 2nd, and 4th grades
  - Vision screening to 1st, 3rd, and 5th grades

### Women, Infants & Children - WIC (810) 987-8222

- FREE healthy food for pregnant and postpartum women and children up to age 5 including:
  - Breastfeeding support
  - Community referrals
  - Nutrition education and counseling
