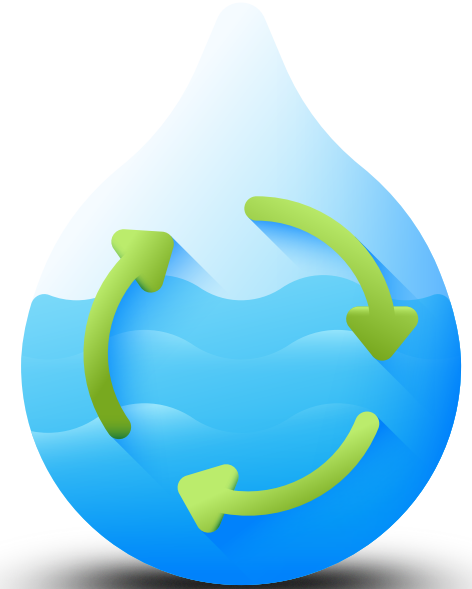

Education Programs

The Water Around Me

Students listen to a story about water, then observe a demonstration showing how pollutants affect water quality. (30 minutes)

My Watershed Address

Students learn about local watersheds and discover how Best Management Practices affect local lakes and rivers. Students also participate in an Enviroscape model demonstration. (50 minutes)

In this abbreviated program students participate in a hands-on activity using the Enviroscape model to demonstrate how pollutants move through the watershed.

Grades
3-6

Learn how precious fresh water is and what a valuable resource we have in St. Clair County during this hands-on learning experience. Water conservation practices will be taught. (50 minutes)

Stormwater Cycle

Students learn about the water cycle and stormwater's role in our local watershed. Students will divide into small groups to conduct an experiment. (50 minutes)

Study the geology of our region by comparing how water moves through different substrates. Learn about groundwater, wells and aquifers. Apply this knowledge to Best Management Practices. (50 minutes)

Students will analyze three aqueous solutions and use results to determine what macroinvertebrates could reside in waterways of similar PH levels. (50 minutes)

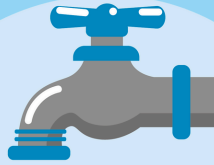
