NURSING DIVISION: INDIVIDUAL & FAMILY HEALTH SERVICES

Children's Special Health Care Services - CSHCS (810) 987-6102

- Assists with care coordination including referrals and advocacy for children who have medical conditions that are chronic, disabling or terminal
- Clients must be under the age of 26
- Lifetime coverage/benefits for qualifying diagnoses

Hearing & Vision Screening (810) 987-5300

- Provides FREE:
 - Hearing screenings in kindergarten, 2nd and 4th grades
 - Vision screenings in 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, and 9th grades

Lead Testing Program & Safe Sleep Education (810) 987-5300

- **Lead Testing Program**
 - Provides education and simple capillary blood test (finger stick) for children 12 months to 6 years old at-risk for lead poisoning*
- **Safe Sleep Education**
 - Provides FREE support and education related to infant safe sleep for parents, caregivers, community groups and family members
 - All services are provided by appointment only

*The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services defines "at-risk individuals (children, pregnant women, older adults, and those with disabilities, among others)" are those with access and functional needs that may hinder their ability to either access or receive information, resources or health care.

NURSING DIVISION: INDIVIDUAL & FAMILY HEALTH SERVICES

Maternal Infant Health Program - MIHP (810) 987-4903

- FREE benefit for Medicaid eligible pregnant women and infants up to age 1
- Assists with Medicaid and WIC enrollment
- Promotes healthy pregnancies and positive birth outcomes
- Helps find prenatal care providers
- Provides referrals and education

Women, Infants & Children - WIC (810) 987-8222

- FREE healthy food for eligible pregnant and post-partum women and children up to age 5, including:
 - Breastfeeding support
 - Community referrals
 - Nutrition education and counseling

Personal Health Clinic (810) 987-5300

 - Pap smear and breast exams for eligible individuals
 - STI, HIV, and HCV testing and treatment
