CD REPORTING: AFTER-HOURS, WEEKENDS & HOLIDAYS

St. Clair County Health Department (SCCHD) would like to remind healthcare providers to report all suspect and actual cases of communicable diseases (CD). Surveillance of CD cases, such as vaccine-preventable diseases (VPDs), requires collaboration along with timely, accurate, and complete disease reporting. This is essential to our community's health in controlling outbreaks, enabling preventive treatment, and education. As these cases can be seen outside of normal business hours, see below for contact information.

During **normal business hours**, reporting is done via phone at (810) 987-5300, fax (810) 985-4340 or Michigan Department of Health and Human Services' (MDHHS) Michigan Disease Surveillance System (MDSS). MDSS may be utilized at any time. **After hours**, contact Central Dispatch at 810-985-8115 or follow your agency's internal policy for reporting procedures.

SCCHD would also like to emphasize that the MDHHS Communicable Disease Division can be reached after-hours, weekends, and holidays at 517-335-9030.
