- Clients must be under the age of 26. Lifetime coverage/benefits for qualifying diagnoses

Hearing & Vision Screening (810) 987-5300

- Provides FREE:
 - Hearing screening in kindergarten, 2nd and 4th grades

Lead Testing Program & Safe Sleep Education (810) 987-5300

- **Lead Testing Program**
 - Provides education and simple capillary blood test (finger stick) for children 12 months to 6 years old at-risk for lead poisoning*
- **Safe Sleep Education**
 - Provides FREE support and education related to infant safe sleep for parents, caregivers, community groups and family members
 - All services are provided by appointment only
