Reportable Disease Update October 2022

Date Issued: October 13th, 2022

The Reportable Disease Update has been developed to communicate infectious disease information to community healthcare professionals. This update will be distributed quarterly to identify and communicate issues, trends in the community, and emerging communicable diseases that can impact our community.

Information Items:

- Flu season is here! Seasonal flu activity is currently low, but there are signs that activity is beginning to increase. The best way to protect yourself is by getting the Influenza vaccine.
 Flu vaccines are recommended for those 6 months and older each year. To get more information on influenza visit https://beattheflu.org/.
- Omicron bivalent boosters are readily available in St. Clair County. They are available for those 5+ who have completed a Covid-19 primary series. The booster dose is administered at least 2 months after your last Covid-19 vaccine. If you have received a previous (monovalent booster) you are eligible 2 months from your last dose.
