## SERVICES OFFERED:

- STI Testing & Treatments
- HIV/Hep C Testing & Risk Assessment Counseling, including Rapid HIV/Hep C Testing
- Sexual Health Education & Counseling
- Immunization Assessment & Administration
- FREE Condoms
- Birth Control Methods
- Pregnancy Testing & Referrals
- Preventative Screenings
- Clean Needles, Clean Works, & Needle Exchange

*Services are available for teens and adults who may be at risk for STIs and/or HIV.*

### WHO CAN BE SEEN?

Anyone who is sexually active or seeking birth control methods, including some groups who are more affected:

- Young people aged 15-24
- Men who have sex with men
- LGBTQIA+ persons
- Racial & ethnic minority groups

### WHY SHOULD I GET TESTED?

- 1 in 2 sexually active people will get an STI by the age of 25.
- 1 in 5 people in the U.S. have an STI.
- Almost half of the new STIs reported were among youth aged 15 -24 in the U.S.
- If you think it can't happen to you... think again. STIs often show no symptoms, the only way to know is to get tested.
- STIs can mimic other health conditions in sexually active adults in their 50s, 60s, and 70s.
- Sexually active individuals less than 25 years old are recommended to be screened annually for certain STIs.

### WHO WILL KNOW?

All services are **confidential**.

### HOW DO I GET TESTED?

Call 810-987-5300 to schedule an appointment.

### WHAT SHOULD I EXPECT? TALK. TEST. TREAT.

- **CHECK-IN:** Second floor reception desk.
- **TALK:** Once in the clinic room, a nurse will ask about current health status, risk factors, and sexual history. If seeking birth control, discuss methods available.
- **TEST:** A physical exam and/or laboratory tests (urine, blood or swab collection) may be required. Some results will be available the same day, while others may take up to 7 days.
- **TREAT:** Treatment is provided. STIs are treatable and many are curable.

### HOW MUCH WILL IT COST?

Services provided on a sliding fee scale based on income. Most insurances are accepted. **No one is denied services due to the inability to pay. Medicaid enrollment assistance is available.**
