OVERVIEW

History of the Millage

Public Act 39 of 1979 is the enabling law that permits the establishment of a Senior Citizens Millage in the state of Michigan. It authorizes local units of government to appropriate funds for the purpose of providing activities or services to older persons. A Special Election on September 11, 1979 established the St. Clair County Senior Millage at .4 of a mill, equating to \$492,605.

Over the years, the millage rate has been increased twice: 1986 to .5 mill and 2012 to .8 mill. In 2022, the rate was rolled back to .7983 mill due to the Headlee Amendment. The Headlee Amendment requires a local unit of government to reduce its millage when annual growth on existing property value is greater than the rate of inflation. Consequently, the local unit's millage rate is "rolled back" so that the resulting growth in property tax revenue, community-wide, is no more than the rate of inflation.

The Senior Citizens Millage was renewed by the voters on August 2, 2022 Primary Election. The 4-year millage renewed at .7983 of a mill. The St. Clair County Senior Citizens Millage is typically renewed by an overwhelming majority of voters. The 2022 vote was no different with *over 78% of the voters approving* the renewal of the Senior Citizens' Millage for 2022-2025.



About Us: Commission on Aging

The Commission on Aging (COA) was established in 1979 via Resolution 79-82 as an advisory board to the St. Clair County Board of Commissioners. The Board of Commissioners appoints the nine (9) member COA with 3-year terms. The positions represent each of the seven (7) Board of Commissioner Districts and the member must reside in the commission district. There are two (2) at-large positions that can reside anywhere within St. Clair County. The Senior Citizens Millage Administrator serves as the Secretary to the COA and is a non-voting member.

The duties and responsibilities of the COA members are as follows:

Stay abreast of current issues related to St. Clair County seniors.

- Educate the public on the resources available through the Senior Citizens
 Millage.
- Make recommendations to the Board of Commissioners on senior services and Senior Citizens Millage annual budget.
- Monitor expenditures of the millage service providers.
- Seeks proposals for new services funded by the millage as the needs of St.
 Clair County seniors change.

Mission Statement

The Commission's purpose is to recommend prudent spending of public funds (Senior Citizens Millage Fund) and to coordinate programs and services that meet the changing needs of St. Clair County seniors 60 years of age and older that promote their well-being and quality of life.

SENIOR SERVICES

Senior Services funded by the St. Clair County Senior Citizens Millage are available to residents 60 years of age and older. Many of the services are free of charge, utilize a sliding fee scale and/or are available for a small donation to qualifying residents. In order to determine eligibility, residents should contact the appropriate service provider.

Services and Providers

There are currently 12 Service Providers and more than 25 programs being funded by the Senior Citizens Millage. Below is a listing of the current providers, along with some details of the services they provide our resident seniors.

Area Agency on Aging 1-B (AAA 1-B) - (800) 852-7795

The AAA 1-B is part of a national network of Area Agencies on Aging that access federal and state grants to support local seniors. The millage provides necessary "match money" to receive the state and federal grants for services to St. Clair County residents.

Blue Water Safe Horizons - (810) 989-5246 or Crisis Hotline (888) 985-5538

Blue Water Safe Horizons offers shelter and support services for survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, and elder abuse. With the assistance of millage funds, Seniors receive shelter, case management and advocacy services.

Catholic Charities of Southeast Michigan - (810) 987-9100

Catholic Charities provides counseling services for seniors and/or caregivers. The program works to assist the individual with life changes such as loss of a significant other person, grief process, coping with chronic illness, marital and family problems, retirement adjustment, economic stresses, housing changes, abuse, neglect, isolation, and/or abuse of alcohol or medications.



Council on Aging, serving St. Clair County - (810) 987-8811

Council on Aging is the millage's largest service provider and offers an array of services to keep resident seniors safe and independent in their own homes. Some of the millage-provided services include the following:

- adult day care,
- assistance with chores necessary to maintain their homes,
- Foster Grandparent program,
- homemaker/personal care services to assist with daily living,
- home repair services for general home repairs or security concerns,
- outreach/advocacy services to identify seniors in need and assist with finding resources,
- programs that provide fitness, health, education, social or recreations activities,
- transportation services to medical appointments, shopping, senior centers, etc.,
- hearing and vision services (new in 2023), including hearing aids and glasses to those that qualify,
- congregate meals and home delivered meals for homebound or impaired seniors, as well as new delivery vehicles, as needed.
- Miles for Memories ID Bracelet Program provides support for the person in early stages
 of dementia to continue to be active. The bracelet allows for emergency and medical
 information to be stored and accessed by emergency personnel when your loved one is
 found.



Housing Matters Inc. - (810) 984-3173

Housing Matters provides temporary housing (2 beds) for seniors who are homeless or at highrisk of becoming homeless. The Foundations Program is a program that opened in September 2021. Seniors must be relatively independent and referred by a partner agency. Port Huron Housing Commission provides a case manager to assist the senior in finding a permanent residence, as well as other supports to remain independent.

Hunter Hospitality House - (810) 824-3679

Hunter Hospitality House (HHH) provides free lodging, transportation and amenities during a medical crisis to St. Clair County residents 60 years and older at one of their facilities. HHH is available to those with a hospitalized loved one or if a senior is needing treatment at a local medical facility.

<u>Lakeshore Legal Aid</u> - (810) 985-5107

Lakeshore Legal Aid provides legal assistance and representation by an attorney for resident seniors. The Port Huron office focuses its work on senior abuse and exploitation issues, domestic violence cases, consumer protection cases, housing and public benefit and other noncriminal matters (legal advice, review/prepare legal documents, etc.).



Life Skills Centers - (810) 331-0030

Life Skills provides a Memory Care program for seniors with Alzheimer's and other related forms of dementia. The millage currently provides a portion of the program cost for low income seniors 60 years of age and older, as well as snacks and meals during the program day.

Port Huron Housing Commission - (810) 984-3173

Port Huron Housing Commission (PHHC) provides bed bug remediation program and a senior bed program in low income housing complexes for seniors 60 years of age and older. Direct service costs are provided for bed bug preparation/purchase of beds and mattress covers/hotel accommodations for residents in Port Huron, Marysville, St. Clair and Algonac Public Housing Commission. In addition, the PHHC provides beds to seniors that could not otherwise afford a bed of their own.

Public Guardian's Office - (810) 985-2095

The Public Guardian's Office provides court-ordered guardianship and conservatorship for legally incapacitated seniors, including designated case manager for seniors to assist with food, shelter and living support. A Case Manager assists with housing needs for seniors under public guardianship.



Sanborn Gratiot Memorial Home - (810) 985-5631

Sanborn Gratiot Memorial Home provides four (4) dedicated beds for seniors that are homeless or in jeopardy of becoming homeless. They provide assisted living services including housing, personal care services, meals, medication administration, laundry services, etc.

Visiting Nurses Association - (810) 984-4131

Visiting Nurse Association & Blue Water Hospice (VNA & BWH) provides Private Duty Home Care (personal care for daily living activities), Home Health (skilled medical care), Hospice Care, respite care for in-home relief to primary care providers and families, bereavement services for individual counseling & support groups, as well as Blue Water Hospice



Home Room & Board supplement for seniors who cannot afford it. In 2023, VNA & BWH began the Personal Emergency Response System (PERS Alert), allowing a senior to call for help with the push of a button.



FINANCIALS

Millage Revenue

The Senior Citizens Millage fund is comprised of revenue from three sources: tax collection, interest income and local community stabilization act funds. In 2023, the total revenue collected was \$5,797,769.



Millage Expenditure

The Commission on Aging makes recommendations for the allocation to each service provider and the County Board of Commissioners adopts the Senior Citizens Millage budget along with the other Special Revenue Funds each December. The following page outlines the annual budget, as well as the actual expenditures for each service provider for 2023.



Fund Balance

In general, Fund Balance is the total accumulation of operating surpluses and deficits since the establishment of the account. Fund Balance can be used annually for operating expenses, special requests, new services or continuation of programs in the event the millage did not pass. The current Fund Balance would allow services to be provided for an additional 9-10 months.
