Thank you for your interest in serving as a St. Clair County 4-H Ambassador! Ambassadors represent the 4-H program by promoting positive youth development, supporting county events, and serving as role models within the community. Please complete this application thoughtfully and thoroughly.

Requirements

- A. Applications due no later than December 1st to the 4-H office, 200 Grand River Ave, Suite 102, Port Huron, MI 48060
- B. Applicants must be between the ages of 15-19 (Seniors), 12-14 (Intermediate), 9-11 (Juniors) years of age. Age is determined as of January 1st of the current year.
- C. A committee will review the applications.
- D. All applicants will be interviewed by a set of judges. An email will be sent out with time and place of the interview.
- E. The applicant's photograph will be taken during the interview process.
- F. Judges will select Ambassadors in each age division, and recipients will be announced at the Winter Achievement Awards Ceremony.
- G. Ambassadors are encouraged to wear appropriate attire for the interview as well as the Awards Ceremony.
- H. 4-H Ambassadors will serve a one-year term, beginning at Winter Achievement and concluding at the following Winter Achievement event
- I. The Ambassadors will be required to be at some main events, which will be discussed at the interview.
- J. 4-H Ambassadors are expected to serve as positive role models and demonstrate behavior that always reflects the values of 4-H.**
- K. There is no limit to the number of times a 4-H member can run for Ambassador.

Responsibilities

- A. Share your 4-H story with the public and help increase awareness of 4-H within the community.
- B. Promote and assist with 4-H events and activities throughout the year, including but not limited to: parades, t.v. interviews, radio interviews, and the Leaders Auction.
- C. Follow the dress code designated to the event. Unacceptable attire includes clothing that: expose undergarments or excessively exposes the body (such as cropped, low cut, or extremely tight shirts, tube tops, short shorts, excessively baggy or extremely low rise pants), conveys a violent, offensive, obscene message or image, promotes the use of an illegal substance.
- D. Serve as a positive role model, demonstrate respect for yourself and others, exhibit leadership qualities, and conduct yourself in a mature, responsible, and professional manner.
- E. role, and act in a mature, responsible, and professional manner.

Application guidelines

- D. Applicants must enter at least two projects at Winter Achievement.
