# From Lori Warchuck's Desk

St. Clair County 4-H News & Events

Hello St. Clair County 4-H Volunteers & 4-H Families. 4-H Volunteers across the state should have

received an email that outlined the path and the process to move forward that includes how to submit a request for permission for face to face 4-H programing including club meetings etc. This face to face request process requires two steps before a volunteer can start to apply.

1.) Volunteer requesting or participating in face to face meeting or event must be up to date in both annual compliance (background checks etc.) in Volunteer Central and enrolled in 4HONline. 2.) Volunteers requesting permission or participating

in the face to face meeting or event (basically all St. Clair Co. Volunteers) must have completed the Communicating Through Conflict Training Module. There are a few ways to complete this new requirement. Requirement takes about 45 min to complete.


