2023 Exhibitor of the Year Award

Recipients must exhibit in at least 5 different project areas. One of those project areas must include an animal project, but all 5 project areas cannot be animal projects. Example: Flowers, Fiber, Photography, Crops & Sheep. Exhibitors can only use 3 awards in any given project in accumulating points. Example: An exhibitor receiving 5 Grand, Reserve or Honorable Mention, or a combination of those, may only use the highest three placing in any given project area. 6. Exhibitors must fill out the Exhibitor of the Year application form and turn it into the fair office in the Community Building no later than Saturday of the Fair at 9 a.m.

4-H Shooting Sports Special Awards 2023

The Carl Kruckenberg Memorial 4-H Shooting Sports Award is to be awarded to a registered 4-H youth in any of the gun disciplines, who exhibits outstanding sportsmanship and is active in outdoor activities, within or out of 4-H. Youth must participate in SCC 4-H Shooting Sports Tournament in the year nominated.

Carl was a member of Rimrock 4-H Club who enjoyed the Shooting Sports and Outdoor Challenge projects. He died in 2009 at age 16 years old. To honor and remember Carl, his family has made this award available. The 2023 award recipient is Avery Whitenight





The George and Peg Walsh Memorial 4-H Archery Award is to be awarded to a registered 4-H youth in Archery Shooting Sports, who exhibits outstanding sportsmanship. The youth must participate in SCC 4-H Archery Shooting Sports Tournament in the year nominated.

The Michigan 4-H State Awards Program recognized outstanding 4-H members during the opening session of 4-H Exploration Days on June 21. At the event, honorees had the opportunity to celebrate their accomplishments with their fellow 4-H Exploration Days participants.

A Michigan 4-H State Award is the highest honor bestowed on Michigan 4-H members, and recognizes a level of excellence in learning, leadership and service.

"With tens of thousands of 4-H'ers across the state, the youth honored with 4-H State Awards are some of our most accomplished 4-H'ers", said Julie Chapin, 4-H state leader of Michigan 4-H and director of MSU Extension's children and youth programs. "Their commitment to bettering themselves and their communities through service and extensive 4-H work make them true leaders in their clubs, counties and across our state."

The Michigan 4-H State Awards Program is open to 4-H members who are 13-19 years old with three or more years of 4-H experience. To qualify for the award, 4-H'ers must submit a written application that showcases the learning experiences, knowledge and skills they've acquired through their participation in 4-H, as well as their contributions to their local 4-H programs, clubs and communities. Submissions are reviewed by the Michigan 4-H State Awards selection committee. This group of volunteers, staff members and industry experts determine which members are selected as award finalists. All applicants receive written feedback from selection committees.

Senior delegates (ages 16-19 and groups then complete an interview using video conference technology. Completing a video interview provides an opportunity for 4-H members to practice real-world skills that are trending in the workforce.

In addition to a plaque, each 4-H State Award winner in the senior division will also receive a \$200 cash award; junior winners receive \$50 cash awards. These awards are made possible by generous donations to the Michigan 4-H Foundation.
