Why 4-H?

People often ask what impact 4-H Youth Development has on its participants. We know from our experiences that 4-H changes lives, helping youth to become confident, mature adults ready to succeed in today's challenging world. Studies show that youth participating in 4-H do better in school, are more motivated to help others, feel safe to try new things, and develop lasting friendships.

We utilize the 4-H Guiding Principles to focus and drive the work we do with young people. As we move into our busy 4-H season we should make it a point to review them as we plan club meetings and activities.

- Youth develop positive relationships with adults and peers.
- 2. Youth are physically and emotionally safe.
- 3. Youth are actively engaged in their own development.
- 4. Youth are considered participants rather than recipients in the learning process.
- 5. Youth develop skills that help them succeed.
- 6. Youth recognize, understand and appreciate multiculturalism.
- 7. Youth growand contribute as active citizens through service and leadership.

Young people will be more interested and active learners if they plan and develop activities around these guiding principles. One of the first steps a club could take is to incorporate the guiding principles in their meetings. Help youth get comfortable with the words and discuss what each principle means. A simple activity exploring the seven guiding principles could also help build understanding. A large sign can be made of each principle. At a club meeting, give the members an opportunity to write a single descriptive word on the principle sign. Focus on one principle at a time at each meeting. Debrief after everyone participates about what that principle means, and the descriptive words used.

After all principles have been discussed at a meeting, a review activity could be done to reinforce what was learned. Create seven groups and have each group come up with a short skit that demonstrates that principle. They could use props or adults to help. This is a fun way for them to reinforce and understand what they mean.

After all the principles are reviewed and discussed, it is important to revisit these guiding principles once a year. This process can help newfamilies understand what it means to be part of a 4-H program. A repeat or review of the activity could be done. Another quick and easy way to remind the group of the guiding principles is to have youth share one of the principles at each meeting and mention a fewconcepts that are connected to that principle.

Michigan 4-H license plate now available!

Michigan drivers have a new way to show their 4-H pride while supporting 4-H youth development programming: through the purchase of the newly released <u>Michigan 4-H</u> license plate. Available at the Michigan Secretary of State, the plate prominently displays the signature 4-H clover and part of the proceeds from every sale and renewal will go to support Michigan 4-H youth.

"We are elated that the Michigan 4-H license plate is officially here," said Quentin Tyler, director of Michigan State University Extension, which is home to the Michigan 4-H program. "We hope the many members of our Michigan 4-H community—youth, parents, alumni and supporters — will consider supporting 4-H by purchasing a plate as they renew their licenses this year."



Similar to other special cause fundraising license plates in the state, the Michigan 4-H license plate will cost \$35, with \$25 of the purchase fee benefiting Michigan 4-H Youth Development. A \$10 fee will also be charged to benefit Michigan 4-H when the plate is renewed. License plates may be ordered by visiting Michigan.gov/sos, by mailing in a form or scheduling a visit to any Secretary of State office. The plate will be delivered by mail in two to three weeks.

Michigan 4-H Foundation opens 2024-25 grant cycle

Awarded annually, the Michigan 4-H Foundation recently opened their grant and award opportunities for the 2025-2026 season. Open to 4-H volunteer leaders, members and staff, the grants and awards support local 4-H clubs and county programs. **All applications are due June 1.**

"County 4-H programs and clubs have so many unique programs," said Abbey Miller, director of the Michigan 4-H Foundation. "Thanks to the support of our generous 4-H donor community, we are pleased to offer mini-grants to support these many wonderful programs."



Opportunities include:

- **Michigan 4-H Legacy Grants of \$1,000.** These grants are awarded to support development of a new program or initiative or to strengthen, enhance or expand a current program that is making a difference.
- **4-H On-Target Grants of \$500.** These grants support 4-H Shooting Sports programs to enhance existing programs, develop a new program or offer a special experience related to 4-H Shooting Sports.
- The Collins 4-H Youth Horticulture Grant of \$500. This grant is available only to 4-H youth clubs and supports advancement of club work in plant science and horticulture activities.
- **4-H Educational Garden Grants of \$1,000.** These grants support the creation of local 4-H educational gardens in Michigan.
