4-H COUNTY MEDALS & KEY CLUB AWARDS

Did you know that 4-H County Medals and Key Club Awards are opportunities for 4-Hers to showcase their 4-H achievements?

County Medal Requirements:

- It is recommended that the applicant be between the age of 12 and 14 years of age by January 1st if you began the program at age 9. Otherwise it is recommended that you be in your 3rd to 5th year in
- the program. Members must be currently and previously enrolled in the project area or related area. You may
- contact the MSU Extension 4-H staff to verify if you did enroll in the project area in which you are applying. Don't assume, verify.
- The application form must be completed by the member themselves, either handwritten or typed. Any evidence of parent involvement will be grounds for disqualification.
- The due date will be December 1st.
- Member must fill out one application for each project or related area in which they are applying for a medal. Member may only be awarded two medals per year and only once in a specific project area for the
- duration of their 4-H career, but are not limited to the number of project areas they apply for.

Key Club Award BASIC REQUIREMENTS: A 4-H Member is eligible who has:

- Reached 15 years of age by the beginning of the Club year
- Completed 3 calendar years of club work as of January 1 of the current year.
- Completed 4-H projects in at least two project areas. Completed a Teen Leadership project.
- Participated in 3 district (state sponsored) and/or State 4-H events.
- Been recommended by his local leader.

A new 4-H year has started and that means it is time to start thinking about the goals and plans for educational, inspirational and recreational activities for Michigan 4-H clubs! No matter what project youth are participating in, it is important to start the year off right!

A good start to the 4-H year will allow youth members, club leaders and parents to be clear about expectations and plans for the group and be excited for what will take place. Some tips to get you started include: Get to know youth and adults and share about 4H! Clubs transition from year to year. There may be members new to 4-H, youth trying new project areas, and members who have left or transitioned to different activities. Make sure everyone

- knows each other with a fun icebreaker activity. Prepare a list of activities for the year. The 4H year goes fast and there is a lot to do in a short period of time. Preparinga list of club activities for meetings is important to ensure youth are learning the life and technical skills of their 4H project.
- · Create a calendar. Once you have your activities picked out, it's time to plan when and where it will all happen!
