Funding for the purchase of the Fort Gratiot County Park property was made possible with a \$2.2 million grant from the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund administered by the Michigan Department of

Natural Resources. The St. Clair County Parks and Recreation millage provided funding for the grant local match and ongoing development of the park.

of Lake Huron. The boardwalk allows residents of all abilities to enjoy the beach and waters at Fort Gratiot County Park.

About Fort Gratiot County Park....

Fort Gratiot County Park is located in the northern part of St. Clair County, just off M-25 on Metcalf Rd. The 30-acre park offers breathtaking views of Lake Huron and 852 feet of beach. Park facilities include restrooms, playground, nearly a mile of paved trails, picnic tables and grills, two picnic pavilions, a canopy tent, drinking fountains, foot washes and a ceremony plaza on the beach overlooking Lake Huron. Park Rules

Fort Gratiot County Park is open daily from 8 a.m. to 9 p.m. Memorial Day through Labor Day. (Park closes at 8 p.m. during the rest of the year.)

Admission is free to St. Clair County Residents.

NON- RESIDENTS PAY AN ADMISSION FEE.

Lifeguards are not provided. Swim at your own risk. Glass containers are not allowed on the beach.

Trails in the park are for non-motorized use only.

Pets must be kept on a leash. Owners must clean up after their pets. Pets are not allowed on the beach.

Campfires are not allowed. Picnic grills are provided.

Smoking is prohibited in all St. Clair County Park properties.


County Parks Information

Tunnel Memorial

On December 11, 1971, a horrific blast ripped through the nearly-completed water intake tunnel being constructed for the City of Detroit's Water and Sewage Department. Twenty-two men who



were working in the tunnel at the time of the blast were killed. The tunnel, located under the grounds of Fort Gratiot County Park, was being constructed to provide drinking water for the City of Detroit and Southeastern Michigan.



On August 21, 2007, thirty-six years after the tragedy, the memorial was dedicated to honor those killed on that fateful day in December of 1971. The memorial now serves as a constant

reminder of those that gave their lives so that others would have safe drinking water.
