Millage Distribution

This year marks the 30th year that the St. Clair County Parks and Recreation Commission (PARC) will distribute 25% of the County Parks and Recreation millage funds collected back to the local units of government.

The current millage rate is 0.4944 mils for 6 years. This has been the millage rate since the St. Clair County Parks and Recreation Commission's inception in 1995, with no increases. In addition to the current millage, a .4944 maintenance millage is being proposed for three years, expiring in 2027, the same year as the existing millage. If voters approve the additional millage, the owner of a house assessed at \$100,000 will pay approximately \$50 per millage for at total of \$100 a year. Both millages expire in 2027.

The millage will generate approximately \$3,459,300 over three year for parks and recreation facilities and programs, with \$864,842 estimated distribution going back to 33 local units of government.

The 2024 Local Millage Distribution table (located to the right) includes the 2020 census figures used to calculate each community's share; the amount of millage funds distributed to each community for 2024; and the amount of projected funds that could be distributed to each local unit of government each year if the proposed millage passes.

In order for the 33 local units of government to receive their annual share of the County Parks and Recreation millage funds, each community's governing board must approve the submission of an annual Local Millage Distribution request form that outlines how the community has spent their share of the millage funds during the past year.
