To support effective planning, SEMCOG utilizes information observed from the real world. We also use computer software to create digital replicas of our region in the future to understand how mobility choices made by people (walking, biking, riding transit, driving, etc.) interact with the capacity of the transportation system and other regional trends and factors (population, housing, employment, etc).

This process is known as modeling, and it enables SEMCOG to forecast expected outcomes of our region and prioritize investments accordingly. Many of the tools SEMCOG uses in its regional transportation modeling and planning activities can be used at the local level. These include:

- Travel Demand Models
- LOCUS: Location-based Services Data and Big Data Analytics
- Iteris ClearGuide: Speeding Map

### **2050** SCCOTS Long Range Transportation Plan Goals & Objectives Survey Results

## Goal 1: Preserve transportation infrastructure in ways that are cost-effective and match our community's needs.

#1- Improve the condition of roads and bridges.

#2- Create maintenance plans to extend the lifespan of infrastructure.

#3- Ensure we are tracking community needs and investments to inform our infrastructure decisions.

#4- Create a plan to evaluate infrastructure assets and priorities in coordination with other infrastructure owners.

#5- Increase and diversify funding to maximize impact of infrastructure investments and support quality places to live, work, and play.

### Goal 2: Increase Safety for all travelers, regardless of mode.

#1- Make transportation safer by minimizing traffic fatalities and injuries.

#2- Improve safety for all modes of travel (including pedestrians, cyclists, and transit users).

#3- Use the Safe System Approach to reduce road deaths and injuries by managing consequences of human mistakes.

#4- Slow down traffic in busy pedestrian areas.

#5- Increase public knowledge of safe transportation practices.

# Goal 3: Ensure that everyone, regardless of differences like race, gender, ethnicity, national origin, age, physical or cognitive ability, or income can easily reach essential services and employment opportunities.

#1- Ensure connectivity between modes and improve last-mile options.

#2- Improve transit reliability and access to jobs and other core services.

#3- Work with stakeholders to create transportation solutions that cater to everyone including historically marginalized communities.

### Goal 4: Use technology to enhance the transportation system in a cost-effective way.

#1- Encourage the use of innovative and cost-effective technologies.

#2- Develop connected and automated technologies for future use.

**#3**- Ensure that diverse communities and users throughout the region have equal access to, education on, and can afford new technology.

## Goal 5: Create a transportation system that is resilient, protects the environment, and improves community health.

#1- Increase infrastructure coordination between agencies and local government.

- #2- Spend more money on stormwater and greenways to prevent flooding and support water quality.
- #3- Make the transportation system better prepared for extreme weather and climate change.
- #4- Reduce pollution from transportation to make the air cleaner and keep people healthier.
- #5- Engage communities to understand their transportation needs and concerns for the environment.

# Goal 6: Help the regional economy by making sure goods move smoothly and efficiently, making trade connections better, allowing more people to work in different places, and supporting tourism, and placemaking.

**#1-** Make places more attractive to people by designing streets that everyone can safely use.

#2- Slow down traffic in busy shopping areas to make them safer for pedestrians.

**#3**- Make transportation connections better between regional economic centers to help goods move around and the economy to grow.

- #4- Make it easier to travel to economic centers.
- **#5-** Provide many transportation options for people to get to and from work.

## Goal 7: Educate and work with local governments, transportation agencies, utility providers, and residents to make the transportation system better.

**#1-** Educate residents about the costs of transportation improvements and potential impacts of different approaches.

**#2-** Increase awareness and understanding of the transportation system and how it is maintained and enhanced.

#3- Get more people involved in transportation planning and decision making.

## Goal 8: Increase spending and options for local governments to meet the transportation needs of their communities.

#1- Help transportation agencies get more money from different places, like the government or private groups.

#2- Identify long-term funding opportunities in the region.

## Goal 9: Prepare for challenges that occur as the region's population gets older, like not being able to move around as easily and not having enough workers.

#1- Provide more travel options like transit, paratransit, shared-rides, biking, and walking.#2- Make the transportation system work better for seniors by making sure they can get to destinations that are important to them.

### Goal 10: Determine how safe and effective the transportation system is by collecting and studying data to make smart investments.

- #1- Make sure transportation spending matches the goals.
- #2- Set goals for each transportation focus area.
- #3- Create a system to collect and analyze a lot of information about transportation.
