Timeline for Taxes:

- 1. Taxes are levied twice a year, July and December (Summer/Winter bills)
- 2. Taxes are payable to the local Township or City through February 28th of the following year
- 3. Taxes become "Delinquent" on March 1st in the year after they were due and are sent to the County Treasurer's Office for collection
- 4. If delinquent taxes are not paid within two years of being turned over to the County, it will result in Foreclosure and the title to the property passing to the County, as required by Michigan Statue.

Can I get delinquent tax information online?	Yes – at <u>www.stclaircounty.org</u>
 Does the County Treasurer accept personal checks or business checks? 	Yes, but not in the months of February or March. Guaranteed funds are required at that time due to impending forfeiture and foreclosure.

Does the County Treasurer accept credit cards or electronic payments?	Yes, go to our website or call www.stclaircounty.org (800) 272-9829 & use jurisdiction code 7071
Is there a fee for credit cards or electronic payments	Yes, the company who processes the transactions charges a fee for their service.
Does the County Treasurer have a drop box	No, delinquent taxes can not be accepted after office hours.
Can I make partial payments?	Yes, starting in 2005 the County Treasurer instituted a policy allowing partial payments in order to make it more convenient for taxpayers to pay on their delinquent and forfeited parcels. Partial payments do not stop interest, fees, or foreclosure, but it does reduce the principle, thus reducing the total interest paid.
 Can my mortgage company or land- contract holder pay the delinquent taxes even if I don't have an escrow? 	Yes, they have an interest in the property; therefore they can pay the taxes to stop foreclosure. Typically there is a stipulation in the mortgage agreement that taxes are to be paid on-time.
 Does the Treasurer accept U.S. Post mark on payments that are mailed? 	Yes, but not in the months of February or March due to impending forfeiture and foreclosure.
Do I get a receipt for my payment?	Yes, the County Treasurer always mails out a receipt to whoever makes the payment.

FREQUENT ASKED QUESTIONS:		
Is there any way to extend the time to pay delinquent taxes?	Yes, in 2005 the County Treasurer instituted a hardship policy and created a committee to review applications to extension of time to pay. Hardship Deferral Applications must be submitted no later than February 28 th prior to foreclosure.	
Where can I get a Hardship Deferral Application?	Either online at www.stlclaircounty.org or you can pick one up in the County Treasurer's office.	
Do my delinquent property taxes go on my credit report	No, because the State forecloses after three years it is not necessary to put anything on the taxpayer's credit report.	
 Can I get property tax information for prior years 	Yes, the County Treasurer has all the property record books dating back to the early 1900's on most properties	
Is there a charge for doing tax searches on the County website?	No, this service is free	
 Can I get a copy of my prior year taxes? 	Yes, additional copies of original tax bills are available for a fee of \$1.00 per year	
 Can I look at the tax roll books myself? 	Yes, there is a research room at the County for this purpose. It is opened 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.	
 How can someone else find out about my property taxes? 	Property taxes are public record	
 Can someone without an interest in my property put a lien on my house by paying my taxes? 	No, if someone pays your taxes they are simply doing you a favor if they didn't have an interest in the property such as a mortgage or land-contract.	
What is tax pro-ration?	Tax pro-ration is something that your mortgage company and real estate agents uses to determine costs for a purchase agreement. Actual property taxes are levied on January 1 st and there are two installments for each tax year.	
What is a parcel number?	It is a unique number that identifies which city or township the property is in and the properties which section and lot. There is only one parcel number per legal description	
What if my parcel number changes?	Taxes should be paid based on the legal description NOT the property address or parcel number.	
What if the County has a different property address?	The County Treasurer gets the owner information from Register of Deeds based on the last recorded Warranty or Quit Claim Deed on file. This information may be different that what the local Assessor uses. Check your legal description before paying taxes	
 What if I pay on the wrong property? 	Always check your legal description prior to payment, the State does not allow refunds for payments made on the wrong parcel.
