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# **PSITTACOSIS AWARENESS**

St. Clair County Health Department (SCCHD) is currently investigating a possible widespread exposure to psittacosis. In humans this condition is usually mild or moderate in presentation; however, it can be severe, especially in untreated elderly persons. Please consider this diagnosis and testing for symptomatic persons with exposure to birds.

### **Clinical Characteristics:**

- Acute disease with symptomatic presentations and respiratory symptoms
- Incubation period from 1-4 weeks
- Fever
- Headache
- Myalgia
- Cough

## Laboratory confirmation:

- Coordinate specimen submission with SCCHD
- Acceptable specimens: Nasopharyngeal (NP) and/or Oropharyngeal (OP) swabs, and any lower respiratory tract specimen including bronchoalveolar lavage (BAL) and sputum
- Swabs should be collected in universal transport medium (viral transport medium)
- Specimens can be kept refrigerated if shipped less than 72 hours of collection; otherwise they should be kept frozen

#### **Recommendations:**

- Consider diagnosis in patients presenting with symptoms and history of exposure to birds
- Report suspect or confirmed cases to SCCHD
- Educate coughing patients to use good cough etiquette
