Hepatitis A Outbreak

In light of the hepatitis A outbreak in St. Clair County it is imperative to address a few key issues:

- Hepatitis A is a very serious illness with great impact on patient's health; it
 is essential that the medical community embrace this and make a strong
 recommendation for vaccine. The idea that hepatitis A is mild, self-limiting
 or does not exist in St. Clair County is simply reckless and potentially
 harmful. Currently >82% of hepatitis A patients are hospitalized and there
 have been 20 deaths.
- Confirmatory test must be done on suspect hepatitis A patients. This
 test is an Immunoglobulin M (IgM) antibody to hepatitis A.
 - Screening for total hepatitis A antibodies (IgG and IgM) can indicate past exposure to the disease or recent vaccination and cannot confirm acute disease. Verifying vaccine status in MCIR should assist.
- Timeliness of diagnosis and communication with St. Clair County Health
 Department is a necessity to interrupt transmission of the disease.
 Intense contact tracing and investigations by public health nurses take
 place on all patients diagnosed with hepatitis A as post exposure
 prophylaxis must be provided to contacts within 14 days of exposure.
- Diagnosing (or inappropriately diagnosing) a patient with hepatitis A
 can have a devastating effect on social well-being as it has been
 demonstrated during this outbreak that patients have been
 ostracized, especially those working in food service.
- Ramifications on food establishments if an employee is diagnosed (or inappropriately diagnosed) with hepatitis A have resulted in financial hardship on the businesses including the loss or closure of the restaurant.
